GB-6900B/GB-X6900B User's Guide for Mobile Link Functions (GALAXY)

This watch includes functions that allow it to communicate with Bluetooth[®] 4.0 (referred to as "Bluetooth" in this manual) capable mobile phones and other devices. Mobile Link functions make it possible, to sound an alert tone, perform vibration alert, or display alerts when a phone call and/or mail message is received on your phone, and to perform other functions. This manual explains the Mobile Link functions of the GB-6900B/GB-X6900B

(referred to as "the watch" or "this watch" in this manual). For details about watch functions, see the "User's Guide for Watch Functions" that comes with the watch.

Important!

- To use the watch's Mobile Link functions so it can communicate with a mobile phone (GALAXY S4), you will need to install an <u>application specified</u> <u>by CASIO</u> (G-SHOCK+ app) on your phone.
- Make sure you always keep your G-SHOCK+ app updated to the latest version.
- The Mobile Link functions you will be able to use depend on the version of the G-SHOCK+ app that you have installed on your phone.

Important!

- You will need to reconnect the watch and phone manually following any of the operations below.
 - Entering and then exiting the phone's Airplane Mode
 - Disabling and then enabling the phone's Bluetooth
 - Turning the phone off and then on

Before re-connecting, be sure to tap the G-SHOCK+ icon on the Home Screen to restart the G-SHOCK+ app. For more information about re-connecting, see "<u>To re-connect manually to the last-connected phone</u>".

Important!

 Performing the Mobile Link <u>Phone Finder</u> operation causes your phone to emit a loud tone. Do not perform this operation when listening to phone GB-6900B/GB-X6900B - User's Guide - HELP - Bluetooth Watch - G-SHOCK - CASIO

audio output through headphones.

Precautions when Using Mobile Link Functions

- Keep the phone close to (within about two meters of) the watch during use. Objects (walls, furniture, etc.) and/or the structure of the building you are in can greatly reduce the communication range.
- Communication may also be affected by other equipment (electrical equipment, AV equipment, OA equipment, etc.) An operating microwave oven in particular can affect communication and even make communication impossible. Use of this watch may also cause interference in TV or radio reception, and disturb video images.
- Since the Bluetooth function of this watch uses the same frequency band (2.4 GHz) as wireless LAN devices, its use in proximity of a LAN device may cause radio interference, slow down the data rates of the watch and other nearby wireless LAN devices, and cause signal noise and connectivity problems.

Disabling Signal Emission from the Watch

The Bluetooth icon (st) on the watch display, either flashing or not flashing, indicates that the watch is emitting radio signals.

When you are in a hospital, an aircraft, or anywhere else where the use of radio signals prohibited, you can disable the emission of signals by holding down the watch's **B** button for about two seconds in the Timekeeping Mode. This will also cause the Bluetooth icon to disappear from the watch display.

Disconnected

There is no connection between the watch and phone when the Bluetooth icon is not on the display. For more information, see "Disabling Bluetooth on the Watch".

Power Saving Precautions

Power Saving is enabled under initial factory default settings.

When Power Saving is enabled, the watch will automatically enter a Power Saving state (return to the Timekeeping Mode, Power Saving icon flashing on the display) if the watch is not moved or if you do not perform any button operation for about two hours.

If the watch is connected to a phone when it enters the Power Saving state, the connection will be dropped.

The watch beeps or vibrates, and displays an alert when a call or mail message is received by the phone.

The watch will vibrate or emit a tone for one second to let you know when the connection between the phone and watch is cut.



Simply moving the watch will cause it to re-connect automatically to the phone.

Tap Operations

To perform a tap operation, lightly tap the center of the watch display with your fingertip.



Example: Tap twice to stop an ongoing tone or vibration alert for a watch alarm.

How to tap:

Lightly strike the watch display twice with the tip of your finger. (double-tap)

Important!

- The tap function is enabled only while the Tap indicator is flashing on the watch display.
- The Tap indicator flashes automatically whenever the tap function is enabled for the following reasons: to stop the phone's phone finder tone, to stop a watch alarm or time up alert, etc.

Pairing the Watch with a Phone

Before the watch can communicate with a phone, they must be "paired", which means they are registered with each other. The watch can connect with any phone with which it has been paired.

Important!

Before performing the pairing operation, be sure to download <u>G-SHOCK+ app</u> and install it on your phone (GALAXY S4).

- Your watch can store pairing information for up to 10 phones. Note, however, that the watch can be connected with only one phone at a time. Pairing is an operation that prepares the watch and the phone for connection with each other. It is not the actual connection between the watch and phone for data communication.
- Note that the procedure for pairing the watch when it is not already paired with any other phones is slightly different from that for the procedure for pairing the watch when it is already paired with another phone.

To pair when the watch is not already paired with any other phones

- 1. Move the phone you plan to pair with close to (within one meter of) the watch.
- 2. Perform the operation below on your phone.
 - (1) On the Home Screen tap the G-SHOCK+ icon.
 - This will display the top menu of the G-SHOCK+ app.
 - (2) Tap "Discover G-SHOCK".
 - If the phone's Bluetooth is disabled, a dialog box will appear telling you to turn it on. Tap "OK" to enable Bluetooth.
 - A message will appear telling you that your phone is searching for a watch.
- 3. In the Timekeeping Mode, hold down the **B** button for about two seconds until the screen shown below appears.

- The Bluetooth icon will flash, indicating that the phone is searching for the watch.
- 4. When the phone finds the watch, "CASIO GB-6900B Discovered" or "CASIO GB-X6900B Discovered" will appear on the phone display. Tap the model name that appears.
 - This will start pairing, which is indicated by the connecting icon on the display.
 - It takes about 20 seconds for a pairing operation to be performed.

When pairing is successful:

The watch and phone will automatically connect with each other. The watch vibrates or beeps to let you know.

The watch returns to the Timekeeping Mode with the Bluetooth icon displayed (not flashing).

Important!

- Remember that "pairing" and "connection" are two different things. The watch must be "paired" (registered) with a phone before they can "connect".
- Once you pair the watch with a phone, you will be able to connect them with each other without performing the pairing operation again (unless you unpair them). For information about connection with a phone that the watch has already been paired with, see "<u>To re-connect manually to the last-connected</u> <u>phone</u>".

When pairing is not successful:

The watch returns to the Timekeeping Mode with the Bluetooth icon not displayed.

In this case tap \leq in the upper right corner of the phone display to return to the top menu of the G-SHOCK+ app, and then perform the above steps again starting from step 2-(2).

Note

If you are unable to pair the watch with the phone successfully, it may be due to one of the reasons below.

• The phone is outside of the watch's allowable communication range.

1. If the Bluetooth icon is displayed on the watch, enter the Timekeeping Mode

- 2. Disable Bluetooth on the phone the watch was last connected with.
- 3. With the watch in the Timekeeping Mode, hold down the **B** button for about three seconds.
 - When you hold down the **B** button, the connecting icon will appear after about two seconds. Keep the button depressed for about one more second and a pairing memory screen like the one shown below will appear.



Pairing Memory Screen

- 4. Press the **D** button to scroll sequentially through existing pairing memory location numbers until one with [NEW] at the top of the display appears.
 - [NEW] indicates a pairing memory location that does not contain any pairing information.



- You will not be able perform a new pairing operation if all 10 of the pairing memory locations contain pairing information.
 If this happens, use the operation under "<u>To unpair from a phone</u>" to unpair from a phone you no longer need and then perform the above operation from step 3 again.
- 5. Move the phone you plan to pair with close to the watch. (Within one meter recommended.)
- 6. Perform the operation below on your phone.

- (1) On the Home Screen tap the G-SHOCK+ icon.
 - This will display the top menu of the G-SHOCK+ app.
- (2) Tap "Discover G-SHOCK".
 - If the phone's Bluetooth is disabled, a dialog box will appear telling you to turn it on. Tap "OK" to enable Bluetooth.
 - A message will appear telling you that your phone is searching for a watch.
- 7. While a pairing memory location with [NEW] at the top is displayed on the watch, press the watch's **B** button.
 - The watch's Bluetooth icon will flash, indicating that the phone is searching for it.



- When the phone finds the watch, "CASIO GB-6900B Discovered" or "CASIO GB-X6900B Discovered" will appear on the phone display. Tap the model name that appears.
 - This will start pairing, which is indicated by the connecting icon on the display.
 - It takes about 20 seconds for a pairing operation to be performed.

When pairing is successful:

The watch and phone will automatically connect with each other. The watch vibrates or beeps to let you know.

The watch returns to the Timekeeping Mode with the Bluetooth icon displayed (not flashing).

Important!

Once you pair the watch with a phone, you will be able to connect them with each other without performing the pairing operation again (unless you unpair them). For information about connection with a phone that the watch has already been paired with, click one of the links below. To re-connect manually to the last-connected phone

To connect with a phone that is different from the last connected phone

When pairing is not successful:

The watch returns to the Timekeeping Mode with the Bluetooth icon not displayed.

Checking the Connection and Reconnecting

You can find out if the watch is connected with the phone by checking the Bluetooth icon (\$) on the watch display. You can also perform a <u>connection</u> <u>check operation on the phone to sound the watch's tone</u>.

On the top menu of the G-SHOCK+ app, tap "Link check". If the watch's tone sounds, it means that the phone and watch are connected.

Auto Reconnection

If the connection between the watch and phone is lost due to Link Loss or because Power Saving is triggered, the connection will be automatically re-established when certain conditions are met.

Auto Reconnection will occur under the following conditions:

- The phone that was last connected with the watch is turned on and its Bluetooth is enabled.
- The Bluetooth icon is flashing on the watch display and one of the icons shown below is displayed when the phone that was last connected with the watch is brought close to the watch (within one meter).



Link Loss icon

Displayed in the Link Loss state.



Displayed while the watch is attempting to re-connect immediately after the watch recovers from the **Power Saving** state, etc.

If Auto Reconnection is successful, the Bluetooth icon will stop flashing (and remain displayed), and the watch will return to the Timekeeping Mode. If Auto Reconnection fails, the Bluetooth icon will disappear from the watch display. Perform the procedure under "To re-connect manually to the lastconnected phone" to reconnect.

Auto Reconnection will not occur under the following conditions:

- The phone that was last connected with the watch is turned off, or it has been turned off and then back on.
- The phone that was last connected with the watch is in the Airplane Mode, or it entered and then exited the Airplane Mode.
- Bluetooth of the phone that was last connected with the watch is disabled, or it has been disabled and then re-enabled.
- The phone that was last connected with the watch is not close to the watch (within about one meter).
- The watch's Bluetooth was manually turned off.

In this case, perform the operation under "To re-connect manually to the lastconnected phone".

- Important!
- If the watch is paired with multiple phones, the Auto Reconnection target will be the phone that the watch was last connected with. The watch will not reconnect automatically with any phone other than the one it was last connected with.
- To connect with another paired phone (other than the one it was last connected with), perform the procedure below.
 <u>To connect with a phone that is different from the last connected phone</u>

Reconnecting Manually

There are three possible methods you can use to re-establish a connection between the watch and a phone. The method you should use depends on the circumstances of the reconnection as described below.

- <u>To re-connect with the last connected phone</u> after connection between the watch and phone is lost for some reason
- <u>To connect with a phone that is different from the last connected phone</u> after connection between the watch and phone is lost for some reason
- <u>To connect with a phone that is different from the currently connected phone</u> when you want to change connection from one phone to another

To re-connect manually to the last-connected phone

Important!

After entering and exiting the phone's Airplane Mode, after turning Bluetooth off and then back on again, or after turning the phone off and then back on again, be sure to tap the G-SHOCK+ icon on your phone's Home Screen to restart the G-SHOCK+ app before performing the steps below.

- 1. Check to make sure that your phone's Bluetooth is enabled.
 - If you can see the Bluetooth icon () in the status bar at the top of the phone's display, it means that Bluetooth is enabled, and you can proceed to step 2. If there is no Bluetooth icon, perform steps (2) and (3) below.
 - (2) Scroll the status bar downwards so the Notification panel is displayed.
 - (3) Tap "Bluetooth" to enable Bluetooth.
- 2. Move the phone close to (within one meter of) the watch.
- 3. In the Timekeeping Mode, hold down the **B** button for about two seconds, and release it immediately after the screen shown below appears.



- The watch's Bluetooth icon will flash, indicating that the phone is searching for it. Wait for about one minute. If the watch's Bluetooth icon stops flashing and remains displayed, it means that reconnection was successful.
- If the Bluetooth icon is no longer displayed, restart the above procedure from step 1.

To connect with a phone that is different from the last connected phone

If your watch is paired with multiple phones, you can use the procedure below to connect with a paired phone that is different from the last connected phone.

- 1. Disable Bluetooth on the phone the watch was last connected with.
- 2. Enable Bluetooth on the phone you want to connect with.
 - On the phone's Home Screen, tap the G-SHOCK+ icon to restart the G-SHOCK+ app.
 - (2) If you can see the Bluetooth icon (*) in the status bar at the top of the phone's display, it means that Bluetooth is enabled, and you can proceed to step 3. If there is no Bluetooth icon, perform steps (3) and (4) below.
 - (3) Scroll the status bar downwards so the Notification panel is displayed.
 - (4) Tap "Bluetooth" to enable Bluetooth.
- 3. Move the phone close to (within one meter of) the watch.
- 4. With the watch in the Timekeeping Mode, hold down the **B** button for about three seconds.
 - When you hold down the **B** button, the connecting icon will appear after about two seconds. Keep the button depressed for about one more second and a pairing memory screen like the one shown below will appear.

- 5. On the watch, use the **D** button to scroll through the pairing memory locations until the one for the phone you want to connect with is displayed.
 - Each press of the **D** button scrolls through the list of paired phones in pairing memory location number sequence.

 - The watch's Bluetooth icon will flash, indicating that the phone is searching for it. Wait for about one minute. If the watch's Bluetooth icon stops flashing and remains displayed, it means that reconnection was successful.
 - If the Bluetooth icon is no longer displayed, restart the above procedure from step 2.
 - If you are unable to connect after a few tries, it could mean there is a
 problem with the pairing information. If this happens, perform the procedure
 under "To re-pair the watch with a phone in order to reconnect".

Note

If you want to connect with a phone that is not paired with the watch yet, perform the procedure under "<u>To pair when the watch is already paired with another phone</u>".

To connect with a phone that is different from the currently connected phone

If the watch is paired with multiple phones and you want to change the connection from the current phone to another phone, first disconnect from the current phone and then connect to the other phone (that is already paired with the watch).

- 1. In the Timekeeping Mode, hold down the **B** button for about two seconds until the Bluetooth icon disappears from the display.
 - This terminates the current connection between the watch and phone.
- 2. Disable Bluetooth on the phone the watch was just connected with.
- 3. Enable Bluetooth on the phone you want to connect with.

- (1) On the phone's Home Screen, tap the G-SHOCK+ icon to restart the G-SHOCK+ app.
- (2) If you can see the Bluetooth icon () in the status bar at the top of the phone's display, it means that Bluetooth is enabled, and you can proceed to step 4. If there is no Bluetooth icon, perform steps (3) and (4) below.
- (3) Scroll the status bar downwards so the Notification panel is displayed.
- (4) Tap "Bluetooth" to enable Bluetooth.
- 4. Move the phone close to (within one meter of) the watch.
- 5. In the Timekeeping Mode, hold down **B** for about three seconds.

 - The watch's Bluetooth icon will flash, indicating that the phone is searching for it. Wait for about one minute. If the watch's Bluetooth icon stops flashing and remains displayed, it means that connection was successful.
 - If the Bluetooth icon is no longer displayed, restart the above procedure from step 3.
 - If you are unable to connect after a few tries, it could mean there is a problem with the pairing information. Perform the procedure under "<u>To re-</u> pair the watch with a phone in order to reconnect".

Power Saving is triggered if the watch is not moved and no button operation is performed for about two hours. The following explains what happens while the watch is in the Power Saving mode.

• The Power Saving indicator changes from displayed to flashing.



- The connection with the phone is cut, so Mobile Link functions are disabled. (All other functions continue to operate.)
- This returns to the Timekeeping Mode.

Note

The Power Saving indicator indicates that Power Saving is enabled. You can disable Power Saving, if you want. For more information, see "<u>Turning Power Saving On or Off</u>".

Exiting Power Saving

The link between the watch and phone may be lost temporarily whenever the distance between them becomes too great or if signal conditions become bad for some reason.

When this happens, the watch will go into the Link Loss state, and vibrate or beep for about one second to let you know (Link Loss Alert).

A Link Loss icon like the one shown below will appear on the watch display, and the Bluetooth icon will flash. The Link Loss icon and flashing Bluetooth icon indicate that the watch is trying to reconnect with the phone it was just connected with.



If the watch is able to re-connect automatically with the phone after entering the Link Loss state:

The watch will return to the Timekeeping Mode with the Bluetooth icon displayed (not flashing).

If the watch is not able to re-connect automatically with the phone after entering the Link Loss state:

The Bluetooth icon will disappear, and the watch will beep and return to the Timekeeping Mode. If you want to reconnect immediately, perform the operation under "To re-connect manually to the last-connected phone".

If you use Mobile Link, the time on the watch is adjusted to the time on the connected phone.

Note

The watch will not perform any alert operation if an incoming call or mail message is received by the phone while time adjustment is being performed with Mobile Link.

Auto Time Adjustment Using Mobile Link

With this method, the watch obtains time information (time zone, date, current time, summer time setting) from the phone and adjusts its current time setting automatically.

The following explains the timing for obtaining time information from the phone.

- When the watch and phone are connected immediately after <u>pairing</u> is complete.
- When the watch and phone are reconnected after recovering from <u>Power</u> <u>Saving</u>.
- When the watch and phone are reconnected manually after <u>the watch's</u> <u>Bluetooth is disabled</u> and then enabled again.
- Whenever the phone time settings are automatically changed due to movement to a different time zone or summer time on/off. (This feature can be disabled by an application setting.)

Manual Time Adjustment Using Mobile Link

You can manually adjust the watch time to the phone time information (time zone, date, current time, summer time) at any time.

There are two ways to do this: using the watch to obtain time information from the phone and using the phone to send time information to the watch.

To obtain time information from the phone manually

1. Check to confirm that the Bluetooth icon (\$) is on the watch display.

2. With the watch in the Timekeeping Mode, hold down the **A** button for about five seconds.

• When you hold down the **A** button, [SET Hold] will appear after about two seconds. Keep the button depressed for about three more seconds and the Time Adjustment Screen shown below will appear.

Normal button operation is not possible while this screen is displayed.

• Time adjustment takes about one minute. After that, the normal timekeeping screen will appear.

To send time information from the phone to the watch manually

- 1. Check to confirm that the Bluetooth icon (\$) is on the watch display.
- On the top menu of the G-SHOCK+ app, tap the following items in sequence: "Settings" - "Time adjustment" - "Send time data".
 - This will cause the Time Adjustment Screen to appear on the watch display for about one minute.

- The watch first displays an incoming call icon, which is then followed by display of the caller information (caller name or phone number). You can also configure watch settings to display an <u>animated figure</u>.



Stopping the Alert Operation

Performing either of the operations below will stop the phone incoming call sound/vibration operation, and also stop the watch's alert operation (tone, vibration, display).

- While the tap indicator (TAP) is flashing, double-tap the watch display.
- Press any watch button.

Important!

Alert Method

Even if you <u>double-tap</u> the watch display or press any watch button to stop an incoming call sound/vibration alert, the connection with the incoming call is maintained on the phone without being answered. To answer the call or to put the call on hold, you need to perform the required operation on the phone itself.

Note

- Certain phone settings and sender languages can cause incorrect display of sender information.
- If you do not use one of the operations under <u>"Stopping the Alert Operation"</u> to stop an incoming call, the caller's information will remain displayed on the watch. Initially, the information will scroll from right to left for about two or three minutes. After that, the first five characters of the information will remain statically displayed. Incoming SNS Notification or Calendar Notification

The watch will let you know when an SNS message (Twitter, Facebook) is received on the phone. It will also notify you when there is a phone alert for a Calendar event registered on the phone.

You can perform an operation on the watch that will cause your phone to emit sound to help you remember where you left it. The phone finder operation forces the phone to emit a tone, even if it is in the silent mode.

Important!

- Do not use this function in areas where sounding of phone tones is not allowed.
- This function can cause loud volume sound to be output by the phone, which can damage your hearing. Do not trigger a phone finder operation while listening to phone output over headphones.

This information can be displayed in the watch's Setup Mode.

*2 Pressing the **D** button after the device name screens of all paired phones are displayed will return to the watch device name screen.

To unpair from a phone

- If the Bluetooth icon (*) is displayed on the watch, enter the Timekeeping Mode and then hold down the B button for about two seconds until the icon disappears. If the Bluetooth icon is not displayed on the watch, go directly to step 2 of this procedure.
- 2. In the Timekeeping Mode, press the **C** button six times to enter the Setup Mode.
 - [SETUP] will appear on the display for about one second, and then the watch's device name screen will appear.
- 3. Press the **D** button to display the phone device name screen.
 - This will display the pairing memory location number of the phone that was last connected with the watch.

- 4. On the watch, use the **D** button to scroll through the pairing memory locations until the one for the phone you want to unpair is displayed.
 - Each press of the **D** button scrolls through the list of paired phones in pairing memory location number sequence.
- 5. Hold down the **B** button until the watch display changes from "CLEAR" to "[NEW]". Release **B** as soon as "[NEW]" appears.

- 2. In the Timekeeping Mode, press the **C** button six times to enter the Setup Mode.
 - [SETUP] will appear on the display for about one second, and then the watch's device name screen will appear.
